#### SUMMARY OF CLINICAL ACTIVITIES

Since receiving doctoral degree in 2000 and license in psychology, I have continued to provide psychotherapy and psychodiagnostic evaluation services for the PTSD research program, and through private practice. The patients seen are culturally and socio-economically diverse. Under the Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and D-Cycloserine Treatment for Veterans and Civilians DOD grant, I have seen veteran and civilian patients for individual therapy employing cognitive behavioral techniques and prolonged exposure and have also completed diagnostic interviews to determine eligibility for research subjects, on an as needed basis. Under the Prospective Study of PTSD in Police Officers NIMH funded grant, I have completed over 200 diagnostic evaluations of police officers over the course of the past 6 years. I have supervised medical residents who are providing

Cognitive Behavioral Therapy to veteran patients (both individually and in a group setting). I have also provided supervision to therapists completing assessments within research protocols. Finally, I have received additional intensive training in specialized therapies including Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for PTSD (CBT), Prolonged Exposure, Cognitive Processing Therapy, and a ten month certification program in Dialectical Behavior Therapy and CBT treatment at the Trauma Center under the direction of Bessel van der Kolk.

#### **SUMMARY OF TEACHING ACTIVITIES**

I have taught and mentored UCSF residents and psychology interns through a formal seminar as well as informal meetings about professional development. I have also taught and consulted with trainees, clinicians, and researchers in the following settings: weekly research team meetings, supervision meetings, one-on-one as needed consultation, and weekly group supervision. I have provided clinical supervision of trainees (UCSF residents) conducting Cognitive Behavioral Therapy within the PTSD program at the San Francisco VA Medical Center. I have also provided research supervision and consultations for UCSF residents and postdoctoral fellows in the PTSD research program by reviewing grant applications, and manuscripts in preparation for publication. I have trained the clinical staff in conducting neurocognitive testing and structured diagnostic assessments for the clinical trials and research studies. I developed the curriculum for a death notification program for the Army. I have also developed 3 hour training modules for the Bay Area police departments on managing posttraumatic stress following critical incidents. Aside from my appointment as a Research Psychologist, I have taught 2 graduate level courses in the clinical

psychology program at Alliant University from 2007-2009. The courses taught were Advanced Psychopathology and Family Violence and Psychological Trauma.
