Clinical: As Associate Chief of Staff for Mental Health at the San Francisco VA Medical Center I am administratively responsible for the care of 7,600 veterans with mental disorders who receive care at the Medical Center in San Francisco, including a 12 bed Psychiatric Intensive Care Unit, two partial hospitalization programs serving 35 patients, outpatient PTSD, Substance Abuse, General Psychiatry and Geropsychiatry programs, and at community based outpatient clinics at 13th and Mission, Santa Rosa, Ukiah, and Eureka. In 1989 I developed the PTSD Program at the San Francisco VA Medical Center and currently serve as an attending in this clinic for 12 months of the year for one half day per week, providing assessments, pharmacotherapy and case management, and cognitive behavioral therapy for combat related PTSD in World War II former prisoners of war, Vietnam Veterans, Gulf War Veterans, Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans and women veterans with military sexual trauma.

Summary of Teaching Duties

In the past three years my teaching activities have been concentrated in three areas, residency training, mentoring postdoctoral scholars and mentoring Career Development Awardees. I am seminar leader for a PGY 1 seminar series on clinical and translational neuroscience, and a seminar leader for a core sequence for PGYII residents on the biology, risk factors, psychopathology, psychopharmacology and cognitive behavior therapy of acute and chronic posttraumatic stress disorder. These seminars are given in the fall and spring quarters for 8 first year residents and 16 second year residents. A major teaching responsibility is the supervision of UCSF Postdoctoral Fellows and VA Career Development Awardees. Currently I serve as a mentor for 4 M.D. postdoctoral fellows, 1 M.D. VA Career Development Awardee and 3 Ph.D. VA Career Development Awardees working in the PTSD Research Program, meeting with all mentees individually on a weekly basis and providing group supervision once a week. Mentored projects include effects of taking a life in a warzone, mediators of PTSD related disability, medications to facilitate fear extinction in PTSD, integrating mental health and primary care for Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans, 4T MRI of PTSD, prospective study of biological and behavioral risk and resilience factors for PTSD in police officers, treatment of Darfuri refugees with PTSD in Cairo, Egypt and treatment of internally displaced persons with PTSD in Medellin, Columbia.
